
- Choosing a File and Picking up on Safety Planning after the Assessment was Clear with worries for Dad Caring for his Children

- BOOM - Half way done!!!!


Mom _____, who is from the _____ Metis Settlement, and



Children's Services wanted Dad and Mom to learn to work on problems without getting angry enough to hit and without drugs or beer. While Mom and Dad work on this Children's Services wanted the boys to stay with other people. This made Mom and Dad, and very sad.




Mom is still working to stay away from drugs that help her head stop hurting. Mom phones her boys when she can and often connects with Metis Children's Services to check on her children. loves her boys and the boys love her. is trying to stay healthy to have more supervised visits. Mom rode the bus for over 9 hours from the Metis Settlement area to attend a visit with and . Mom has recently attended AA, Women's Group, and Church to help her deal with her problems. Mom wants to stay away from drugs to make sure she can arrange more visits with her boys and feel better.



Dad is starting to spend more time with and . The boys started with day visits on Saturday, then day visits Saturday and Sunday. Now they have sleepovers on the weekends. Sometimes they start Friday and go to Sunday. Dad also planned a longer visit with his boys over the holidays in B.C. with Grandma . Dad now has his own place and is planning visits that carry on during the week. Eventually Dad hopes to live with all his boys.
